A clinical documentation specialist (CDS) can play a key role in the success of these programs, yet many nurses are unfamiliar with this career option.

The majority of clinical documentation specialists are drawn from either a nursing background or a health information background. To become a licensed Registered Nurse requires either an associate degree in nursing (ADN) or a bachelor's degree in nursing (BSN) followed by a pass on the NCLEX-RN licensure examination. Clinical documentation specialists deal primarily with doctors, nurses, and other health professionals to clarify issues and add missing information to ensure policies and regulations are met.
